Dear Folks:

We arrived at Camp Divers
in Ayer Mass.

We left Framingham
Saturday 9 o'clock and we
walked all the way it was so
hot that they would only
let us walk 9 miles a day
Saturday and Sunday it
wasn't bad but today it
was so hot that about 200
out of the 2000 in the regiment
dropped out overcome by
the heat.

I was so hot that I
nearly fell out myself but I

arrived O.K.

Two fellows from this regiment died to-day on the hike on account of the heat.

Well this is a regular camp its a regular city and a lot of people work here.

Lots of carpenters, plumbers etc. we live in tents but when the barracks are ready we will live in them. 200 in one barrack.

Well I'll close now.
